## Who we are

Five Mile Radius was founded in 2019 to accelerate construction's shift to a circular economy through the practice of architecture and product design. We are a circular design studio working with waste and bio-based materials across architecture, interiors and furniture.

Based in Brisbane and working across Australia, our studio combines architecture and fabrication under one roof. Architects and product designers work alongside carpenters and furniture makers in our in-house workshop, allowing ideas to move seamlessly from concept to prototype to built outcome. Our long-standing relationships with demolition contractors, material suppliers and builders give us direct access to material streams others overlook.

We work with brands, businesses and public clients who want their spaces to reflect their values. Through architecture, interiors and furniture, we deliver contemporary, commercially robust environments that are distinctive, durable and good for the planet.

Our work has been widely recognised, including Gabriel Poole Building of the Year and multiple state and national awards. We have delivered projects for clients including Arup, Lendlease and Brisbane Airport, alongside a growing network of forward-thinking organisations.



Our name comes from 20th century Gandhian philosophy, which advocates building with materials sourced within a “five mile radius” of a site to support local economy, environment and culture. In Australia, that radius often extends, but the underlying mindset remains the same.

## What we do

### Architecture

As architects, our services include

- Full architectural and interior design
- Design collaboration within larger consultant teams
- Reuse and material procurement consulting
- Integrated joinery and furniture design

Every project begins with fundamentals: a clear brief, rigorous spatial planning, operational performance and a resolved aesthetic response to context. We prioritise functionality, compliance, buildability and long-term durability from day one.

Our speciality lies in connecting projects to material opportunity. Alongside a typical architectural process, we identify local supply chains, demolition streams and underused resources that can strengthen both the design outcome and the commercial narrative. We work pragmatically, selecting materials and systems that suit the brief, the budget and the brand.

Where appropriate, we fabricate joinery and furniture in-house to maintain quality, protect design intent and control costs. For larger construction works, we partner with appointed builders while remaining closely involved through documentation and delivery. On projects such as Matso's Brewery, we completed full architectural documentation, collaborated with Hutchinson Builders during construction, and fabricated the furniture using materials salvaged from onsite demolition.

At project completion, we provide clear documentation outlining material reuse and environmental impact, giving clients tangible data and a credible story they can share with customers, stakeholders and their community.

Our approach balances architectural rigour, commercial performance and brand-defining environments.

We deliver architecture and interior design across hospitality, workplace and public projects. We are award winning architects with experience delivering projects ranging from \$30,000 fit-outs to \$6,000,000 commercial builds.

## What we do

### Furniture

As furniture makers, our services include:

- Core Collection, available made-to-order and customisable
- Custom furniture and joinery for commercial environments
- Design using client-supplied or site-recovered materials

Our aim is not to make furniture that looks recycled, but furniture that feels considered, confident and built to last. Every piece begins with good design. Strong proportions, structural integrity and a clear contemporary aesthetic suited to commercial use.

Our Core Collection is developed from material streams we know we can continually access. Each design is the result of ongoing testing and research into what performs structurally and visually when working with salvage. Steel, solid timber and concrete are selected because they endure, age well and hold their integrity in high-use environments.

Alongside the collection, we regularly work with our clients' own waste. This might include raw materials recovered from demolition, surplus stock, or existing furniture reworked and given new life. We see this as an opportunity to create something specific to place and story.

All furniture is designed for durability and future disassembly. Components are mechanically fixed wherever possible, allowing repair, adaptation and material separation over time.

For commercial projects, we provide CAD drawings, warranties, provenance certificates and project photography to support documentation and storytelling.

Our approach balances design clarity, material intelligence and long-term use.

We design and fabricate furniture and joinery in Brisbane using reclaimed, surplus and bio-based materials. Our combined design and fabrication capability allows for both repeatable systems and bespoke outcomes, tailored to the needs of each project.

## Why we're different

We start with local materials and helping clients eliminate waste. Circularity sits at the heart of our process, but beauty, functionality and commercial performance are never compromised.

- Local First** We prioritise nearby materials, suppliers and makers. Local sourcing reduces transport costs and emissions, strengthens regional networks and keeps projects grounded in place.
- Build with What Already exists** Where possible, we work with reclaimed, surplus or local, low-carbon materials. This reduces embodied energy and often unlocks distinctive, cost-effective outcomes.
- Understand the Full Lifecycle** We consider where materials come from and where they will go next. Designing with end-of-life in mind reduces future waste.
- Design for Durability and Repair** We favour solid, separable materials and mechanical fixings over unnecessary composites and permanent bonding. This allows furniture and spaces to be repaired, adapted or reconfigured over time.
- Protect Health and Occupancy** We select finishes and materials that are safe to make, install and use. Healthy spaces are better for employees, customers and long-term performance.
- Only Build What Adds Value** We design efficiently. Every element should serve a clear operational, spatial or brand purpose.
- Measure and Communicate Impact** We provide documentation outlining material reuse and environmental performance, giving business owners a credible story to share.

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# Scarborough Bakery

## Circular hospitality fitout

**Country** Turrbal

**Overview** Five Mile Radius transformed a bayside tenancy in Scarborough into Landing Bakery, a new hospitality venue that demonstrates the potential of circular design in small-scale fit-outs.

Every element was prefabricated in the Five Mile Radius workshop. Components were milled, cast, and assembled under controlled conditions to minimise offcuts, waste, and allow for rapid installation on site. All joinery, furniture, and finishes were designed to be screwed rather than glued, allowing the fit-out to be fully disassembled and reused in the future.

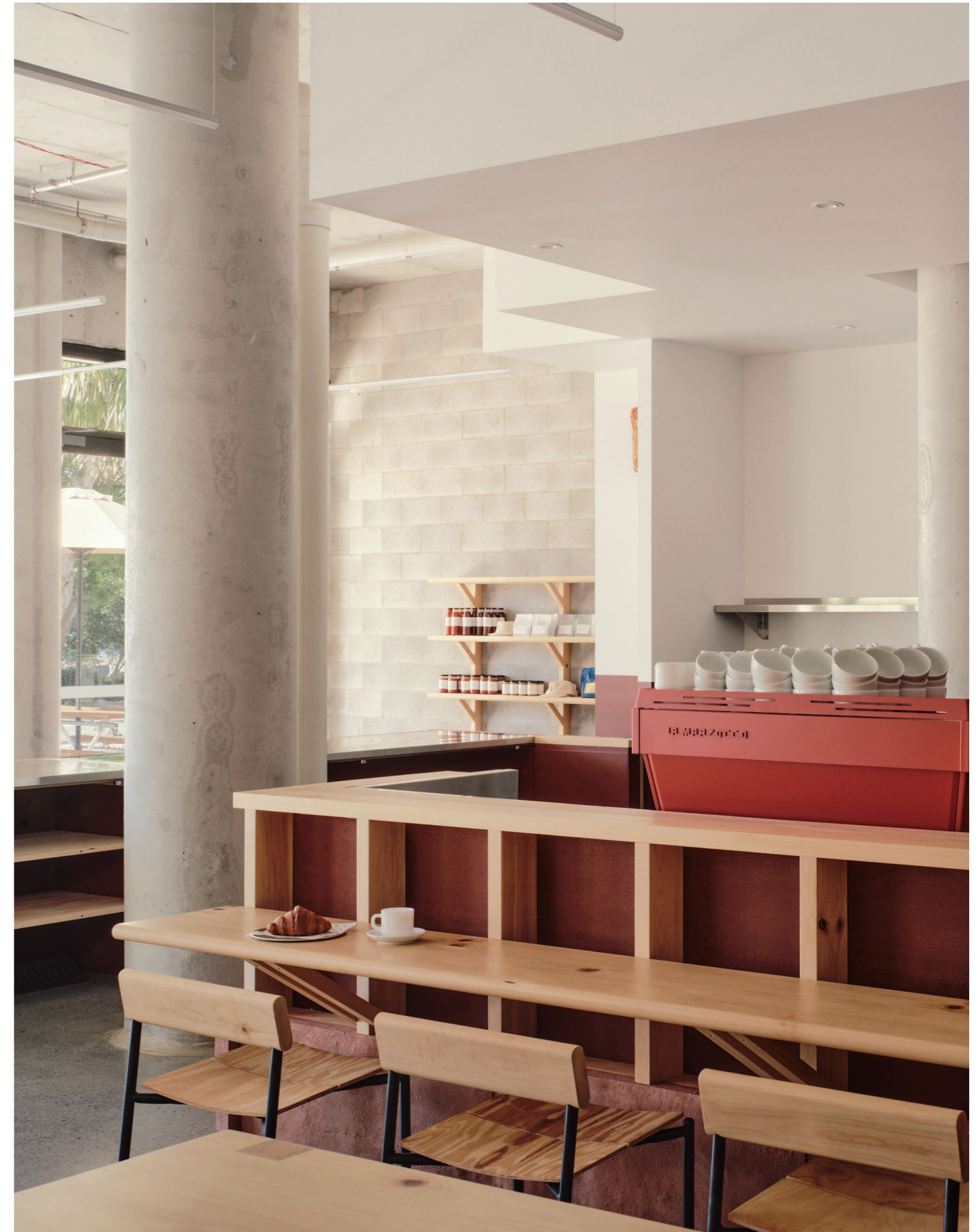
The material palette reflected both regional sourcing and waste diversion: Queensland-grown hoop pine, sandcast concrete panels made from salvaged overpour and locally sourced sand, deadstock plywood sheets from the 1990s, recycled brush box from the client's own stock, and salvaged steel bases reconditioned for new life.

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# Matso's Sunshine Coast Brewery

## Adaptive Reuse Brewery and Public Garden

**Country** Kabi Kabi

**Overview** Five Mile Radius led the sustainable transformation of a heritage-listed pub in Eumundi into a new public brewery and garden, demonstrating the potential of adaptive reuse in regional Queensland.

The project preserved existing structures while creating new, shed-inspired pavilions using passive ventilation, natural shading, and reclaimed materials to reduce operational energy and embodied carbon. Custom furnishings and fixtures were fabricated in-house using salvaged hardwood, concrete, and steel, embedding circularity into every element.

The project was completed on time and on budget, and was later awarded the AIA 2025 (QLD) Award for Commercial Architecture and the Gabriel Poole Building of the Year.

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# Arup Brisbane Workplace Circular Interior Fit-Out

**Country** Turrbal

**Overview** Five Mile Radius partnered with Hassell Studio, Blaklash and Arup to deliver an industry-leading circular interior fit-out for Arup's Brisbane headquarters. The project was designed to meet the Living Building Challenge and set a new benchmark for regenerative, low-carbon design.

As material consultants and fabricators, we helped embed circular economy principles, First Nations perspectives, local storytelling and construction waste reuse into every layer of the project.

Our work included auditing existing and salvaged materials for reuse, sourcing regional reclaimed resources, advising on detailing for disassembly and fabricating over \$150,000 of bespoke furniture using salvaged Brisbane construction waste. In total, 106 salvaged materials were used on the project.

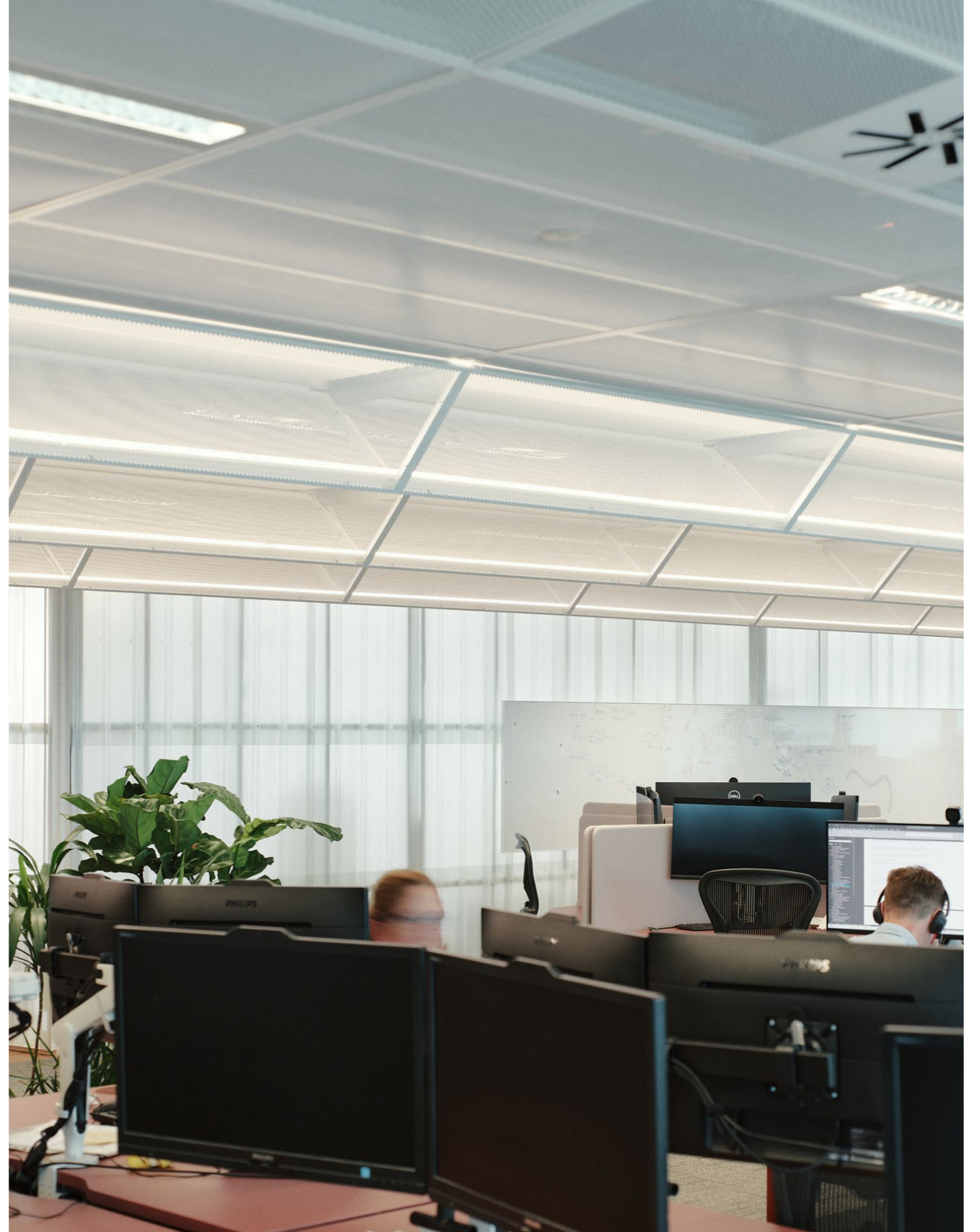

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# Bulimba office

## Circular Interior Fit-Out

**Country** Turrbal

**Overview** Bulimba Office is a workplace fit-out designed and fabricated by Five Mile Radius for innovative lighting company Bluebottle's new Brisbane headquarters.

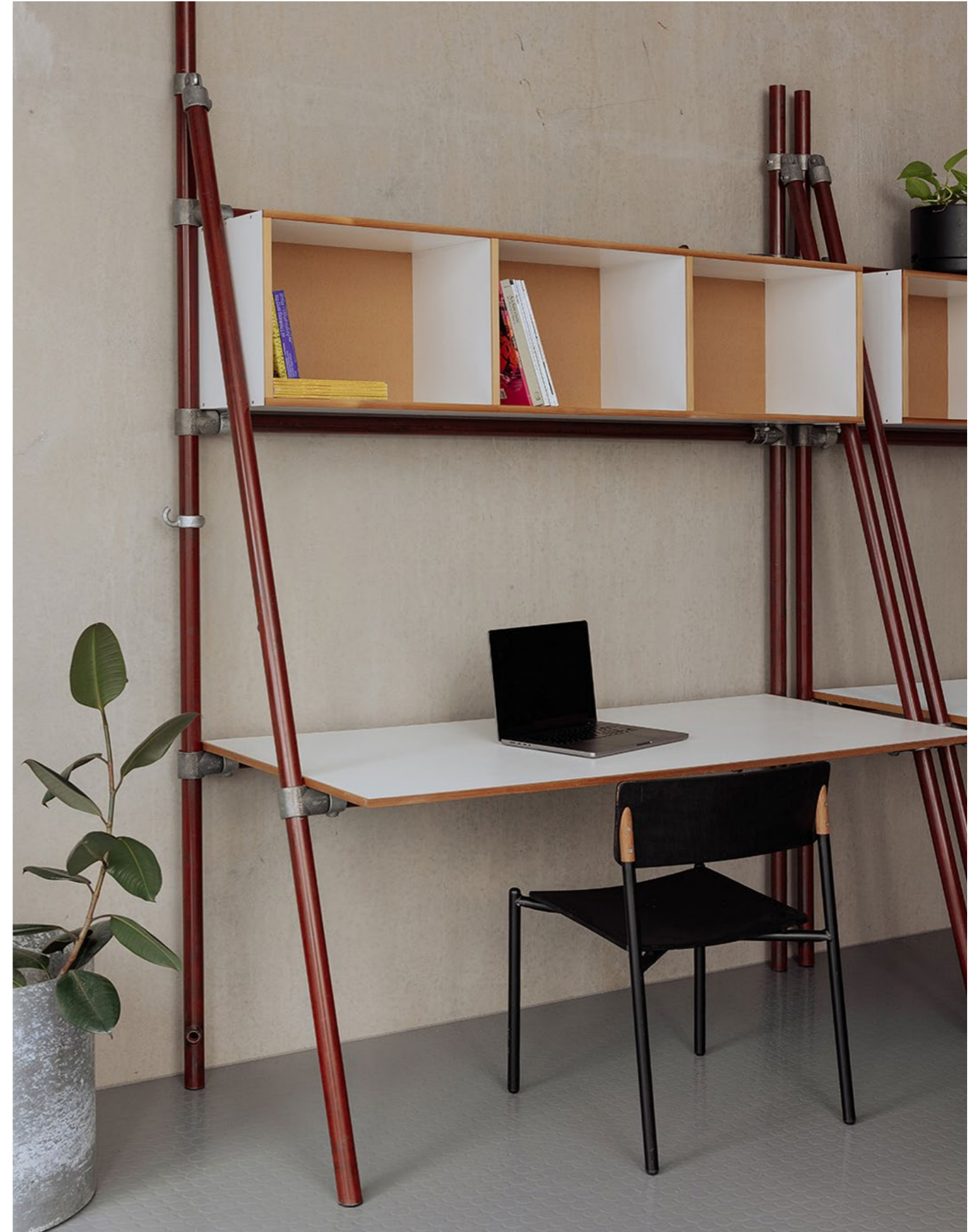
The project delivered a flexible, locally made interior centred on material reuse. Decommissioned 42mm fire sprinkler pipe was salvaged and used to form the structure of workstations and joinery, with clamp fittings chosen for ongoing adaptability. Salvaged packing sheets were repurposed as work surfaces.

All elements were prefabricated in the Five Mile Radius workshop, allowing the fit-out to be flat-packed, delivered, and assembled rapidly on site with minimal waste.

# Doolandella Brickscreen

## Artist-integrated façade

**Country** Jagera

**Overview** Doolandella Brickscreen is a 45m<sup>2</sup> artist-integrated façade developed for a new Woolworths precinct in Brisbane. Designed and fabricated by Five Mile Radius in close collaboration with artist Jody Rallah (Yuggera-Yuggerabul/Biri-bindal), the project centred First Nations perspectives, local ecologies, and cultural memory.

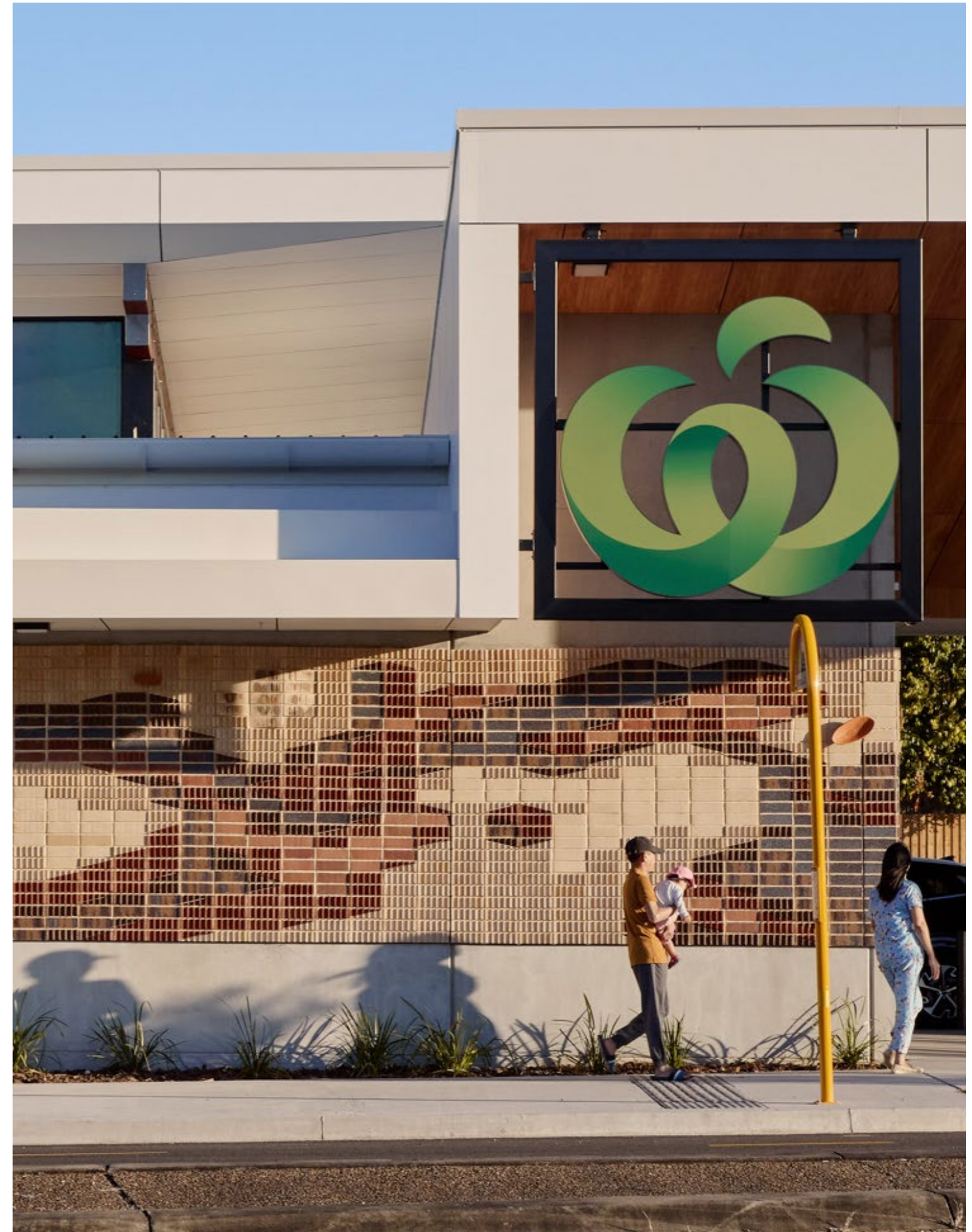
The screen translated Jody’s mural into a modular brickwork façade made from over 1,300 hand-cut bricks, formed of Brisbane clays. Each piece was catalogued and arranged through a detailed “paint-by-numbers” system to ensure accurate installation.

The result is a 21-metre-long, 2-metre-high façade that merges architectural function with cultural storytelling.

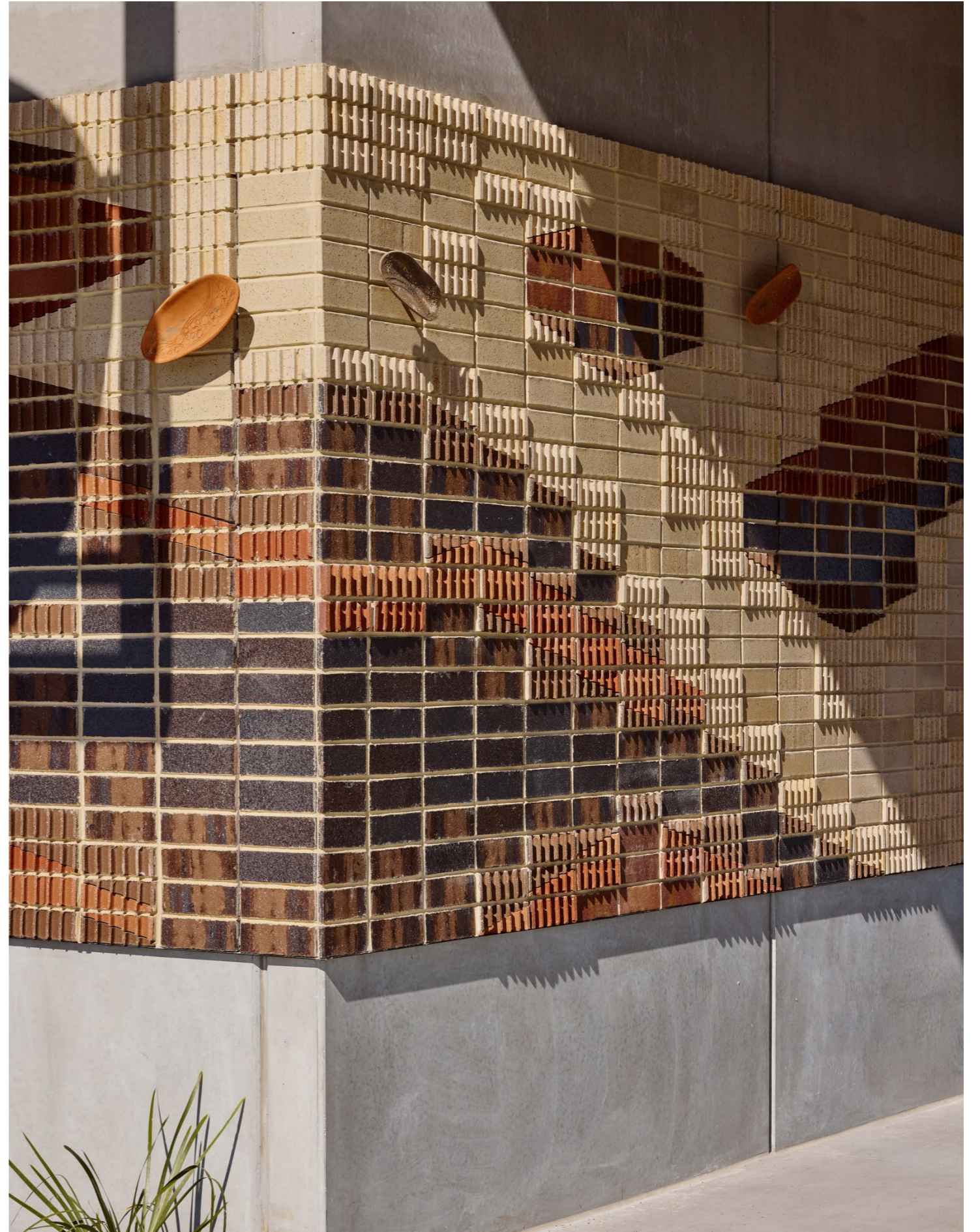

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# Tweed Workplace

## Circular Commercial Fit-Out

**Country** Ngandowal + Minyungbal

**Overview** Five Mile Radius collaborated with Dan Wilson Architect to transform a standard industrial warehouse in Tweed Heads into a workplace and logistics hub, constructed almost entirely from local reclaimed materials.

Working within a strict \$50,000 budget and 4-month delivery timeframe, we created modular workstations, partitions, and storage solutions. Every element was designed for disassembly, reuse, or relocation to ensure long-term circularity.

The project used architectural intervention to maximise material reuse, with over 90% of new works fabricated from salvaged resources sourced from Brisbane and Northern Rivers demolition streams. It was later commended for the AIA 2025 (QLD) Award for Small Project Architecture.

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# Bond Street Office

## Circular office fitout

**Country** Jagera + Turrbal

**Overview** Five Mile Radius reimagined an underutilised loading dock in West End, Brisbane, into a dynamic office and urban-facing laneway activation, showcasing the potential of circular design at a small commercial scale.

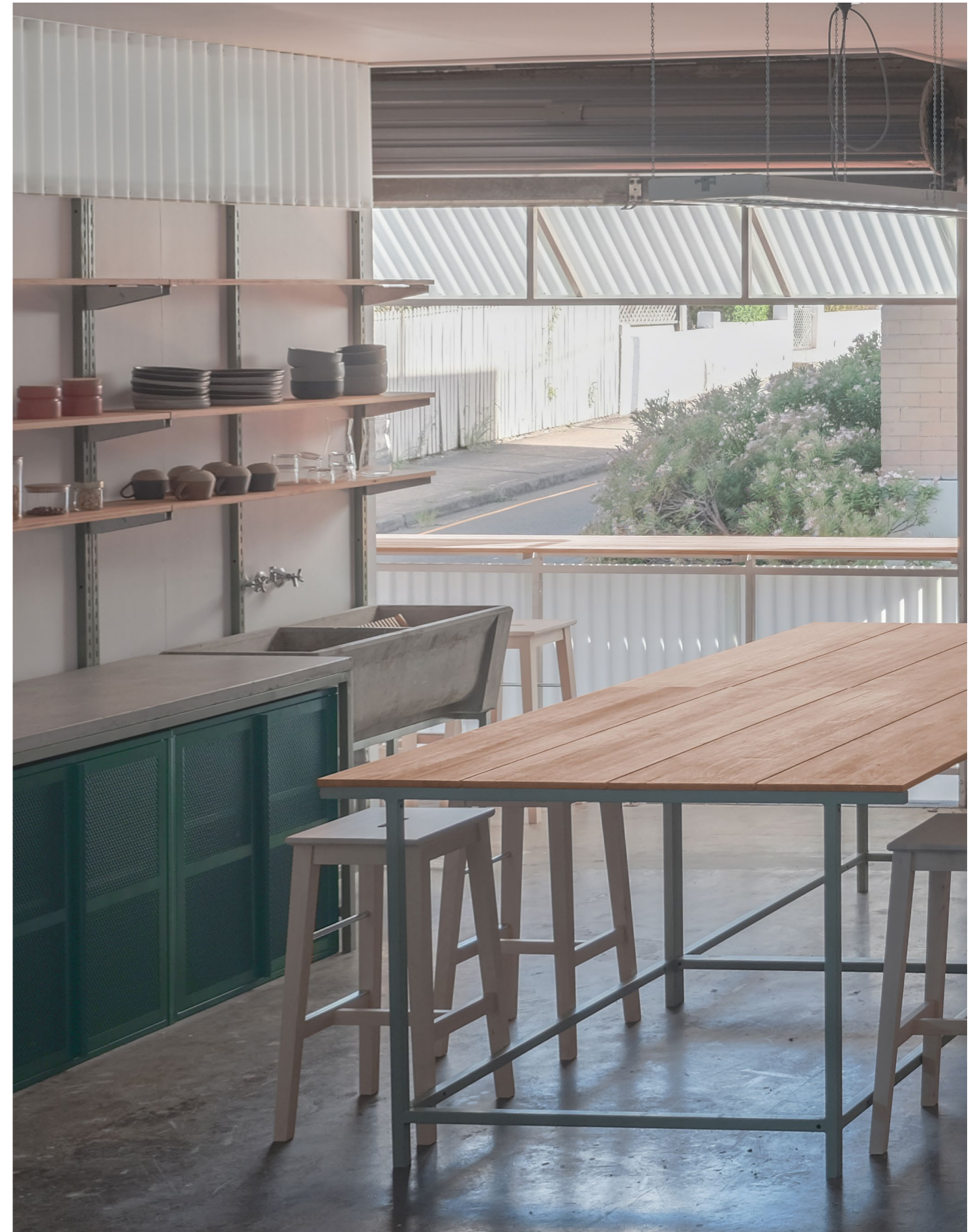
The project is comprised of 95% reclaimed steel, concrete, and timber sourced from local demolition yards. Prefabrication in our workshop allowed rapid, low-waste delivery, with minimal disruption to the site and surrounding community.

We developed a modular 700mm grid system for workstations, shelving, and partitions – enabling full disassembly, reuse, and reconfiguration to extend the project’s lifecycle and support future tenant changes.

# Waste Terrazzo

## Coffee and Side Tables

### Overview

The Waste Terrazzo coffee and side tables are compact, versatile pieces suited to hospitality, workplace and residential settings. Each table pairs a refined terrazzo surface with a robust steel base.

Fully customisable in diameter, height and aggregate selection.

### Manufacturing Info

Cast in our Brisbane workshop using salvaged concrete overpour and demolition aggregate, each top is poured into reusable moulds and hand-ground to expose the terrazzo surface. A penetrative food-grade sealer protects the surface for indoor and outdoor use. Bases are fabricated from reclaimed steel reinforcing offcuts and finished for durability.

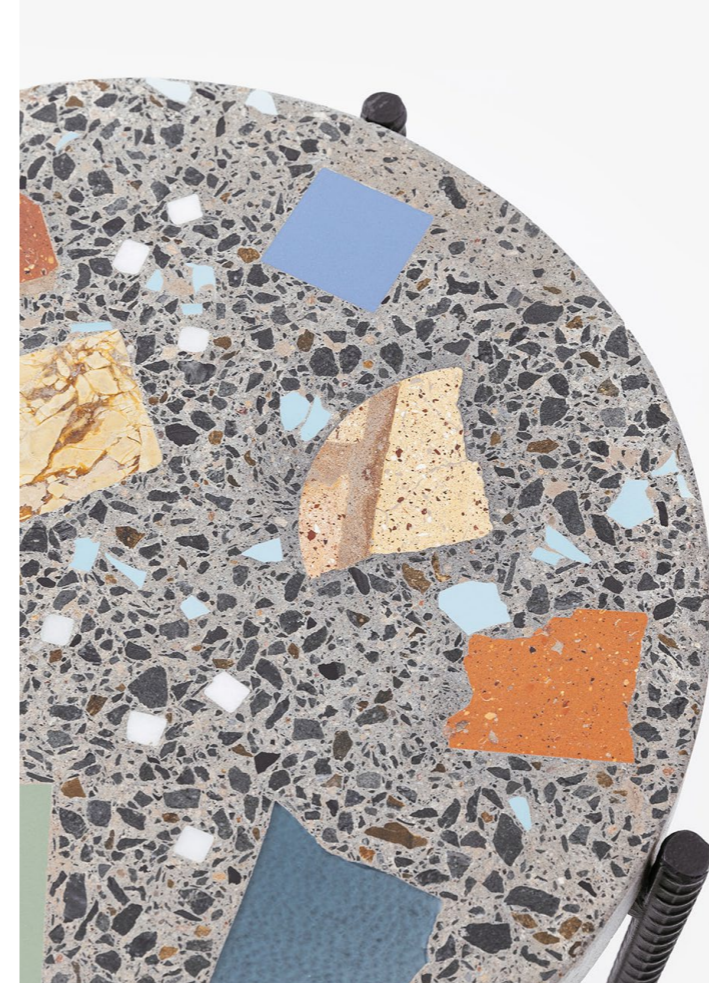

# Waste Terrazzo Custom Tables



**Overview** Waste Terrazzo dining tables are designed for hospitality, workplace and shared commercial settings. Fabricated at larger diameters and a range of formats, they provide the structural stability required for high-use environments.

**Manufacturing Info** Each table top is cast in our Brisbane workshop using salvaged concrete overpour and crushed aggregate. Tops are reinforced, hand-ground to expose the terrazzo finish and sealed with a food-grade penetrative sealer for durability and stain resistance.

**Customisation** Fully customisable in size, height and aggregate selection. Clients may also select from our recycled steel base designs or provide their own base for integration.

# Waste Terrazzo Custom Slabs



## Overview

Waste Terrazzo slabs are fabricated as architectural surfaces for benchtops, counters, vanities and integrated joinery. Designed for commercial fit-outs, each slab is cast to specification and detailed for installation within cabinetry and built elements.

Fully customisable in length, width, thickness and aggregate composition.

## Manufacturing Info

Each slab is cast in our Brisbane workshop using salvaged concrete overpour and graded demolition aggregate. Surfaces are reinforced, hand-ground to expose the terrazzo finish and sealed with a commercial-grade penetrative sealer for durability and stain resistance.

Cut-outs, edge profiles and installation detailing can be incorporated to suit project requirements.

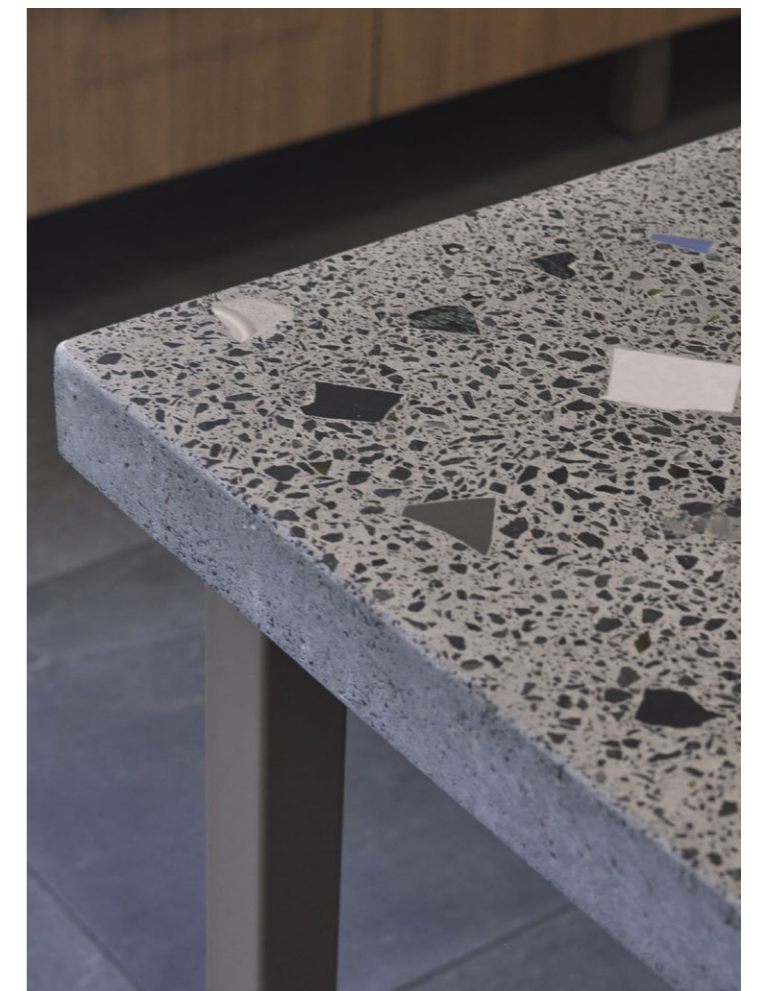
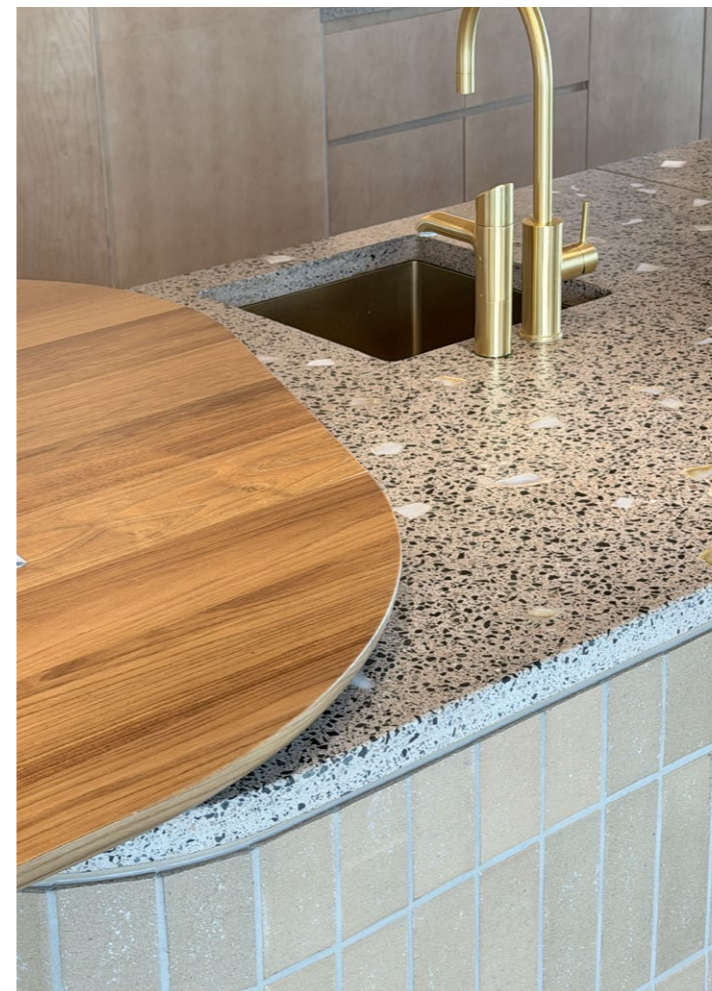

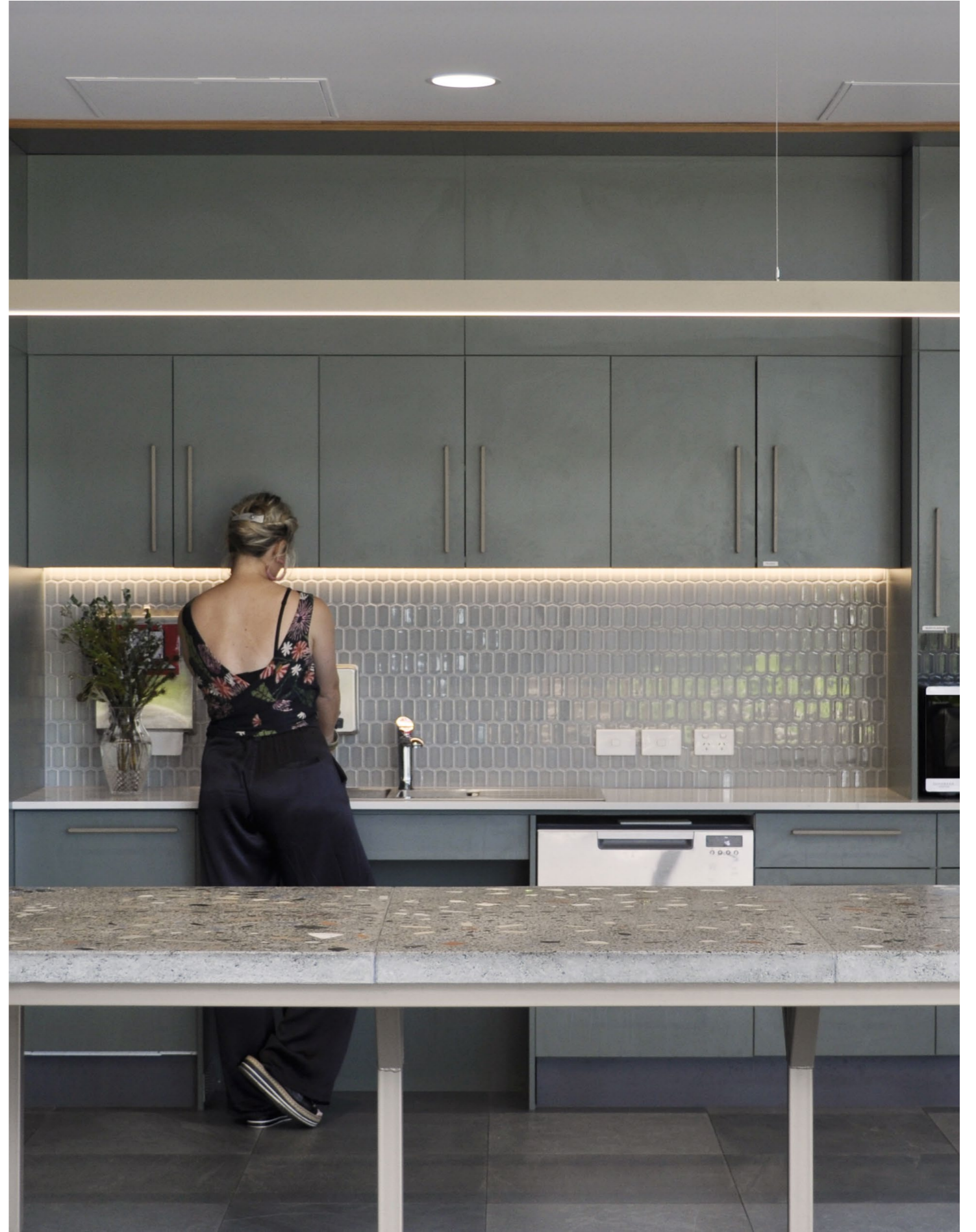

# Pigmented Concrete Coffee and Side Tables

## Overview

The Pigmented Concrete Table is a handcrafted piece fabricated in Brisbane, designed for both indoor and outdoor use. It blends durability with design versatility, serving as a side or coffee table.

## Manufacturing Info

Each table is cast using excess wet concrete, sourced as waste from construction sites, poured into reusable formwork, creating a unique surface texture. Reclaimed surplus stock of oxide pigments add color, while the top is supported by a handcrafted base made of reclaimed steel reinforcing or hoop pine peeler cores. Standard colours are pink, green and blue.

## Customisation

Diameter and height can be specified to suit functional requirements, from lounge to hospitality and commercial environments, with options including pedestal bases for high-use applications. Steel leg finishes and concrete oxide pigment can also be customised to align with colour palettes or brand identity.

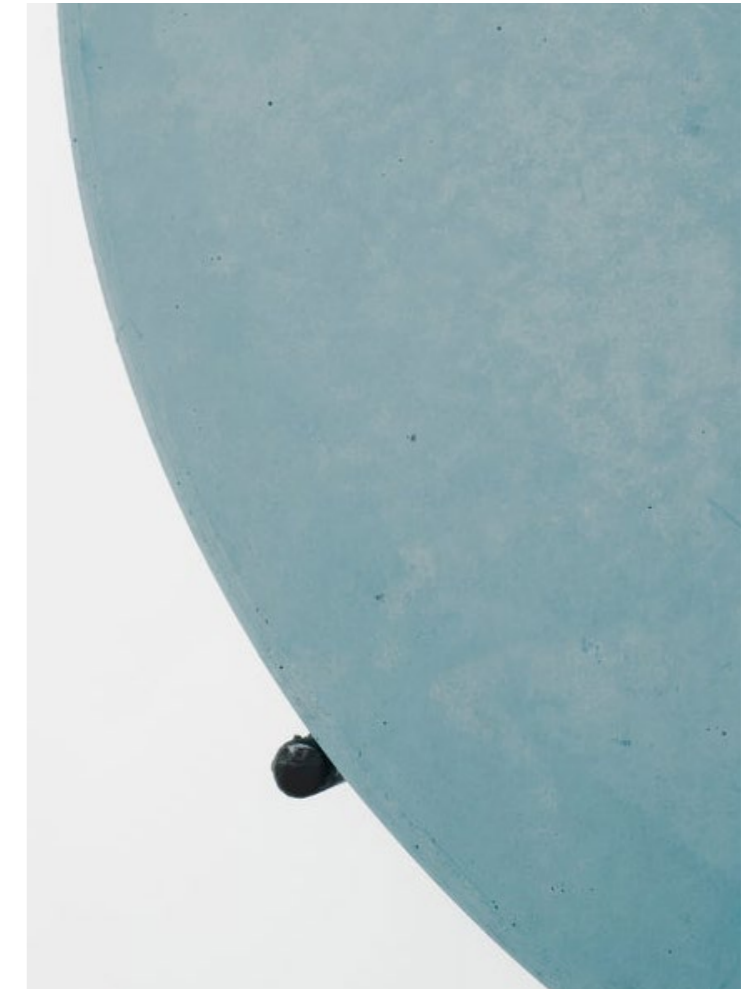

# Pigmented Concrete Custom Slabs



## Overview

Pigmented Concrete is a reinforced concrete surface formed from reclaimed construction waste and surplus materials. Each custom slab is cast using excess wet concrete sourced directly from local construction sites, diverting overpour from landfill and redirecting it into new architectural applications.

## Manufacturing Info

Designed for commercial hospitality, retail, workplace and public environments, Pigmented Concrete slabs are fabricated to order as benchtops, tabletops, servery counters, bathroom vanities and street furniture. Colour is introduced through reclaimed surplus oxide pigments. Rather than polished, the surface is burnished.

## Customisation

Colour produced by the oxide pigments can be developed in consultation to align with colour palettes, brand identity or wayfinding strategies.

# Telegraph Stools

## Stool, Side Table



### Overview

Our Telegraph Stools are made out of decommissioned timber power poles sourced from across Australia. Handmade and individually unique, these stools are suitable for use as a stool or side table, inside and outdoors.

### Manufacturing Info

Telegraph Stools are handcrafted from decommissioned Australian hardwood power poles reclaimed prior to disposal and supplied by Kennedy's Timbers. Although poles are replaced due to localised ground-line failure, most of the timber remains structurally sound and suitable for reuse.

By hand, we use a chainsaw to split each segment of log to form two stools in order to minimise any timber waste during production. We then char the surface of each stool to increase its durability before finishing using a natural hardwax oil.

# Telegraph Bench

## Bench Seat, Plinth Table



### Overview

Our Telegraph Bench is made from old timber power poles salvaged from across Australia, celebrating the strength and beauty of reclaimed materials. Built for indoor or outdoor use, it's designed to sit comfortably on uneven ground. Use it as a bench for two or a low side table.

### Manufacturing Info

The Telegraph Bench is crafted from decommissioned Australian hardwood power poles, reclaimed prior to disposal and supplied by Kennedy's Timbers. While poles are typically replaced due to localised ground-line failure, most of the untreated hardwood remains structurally sound and suitable for reuse.

The bench is offered in a natural or charred finish. Each bench is supported by custom concrete blocks cast in our Brisbane workshop using salvaged excess concrete from local building sites, combining reclaimed timber and recycled concrete into a durable piece suitable for indoor or outdoor use.

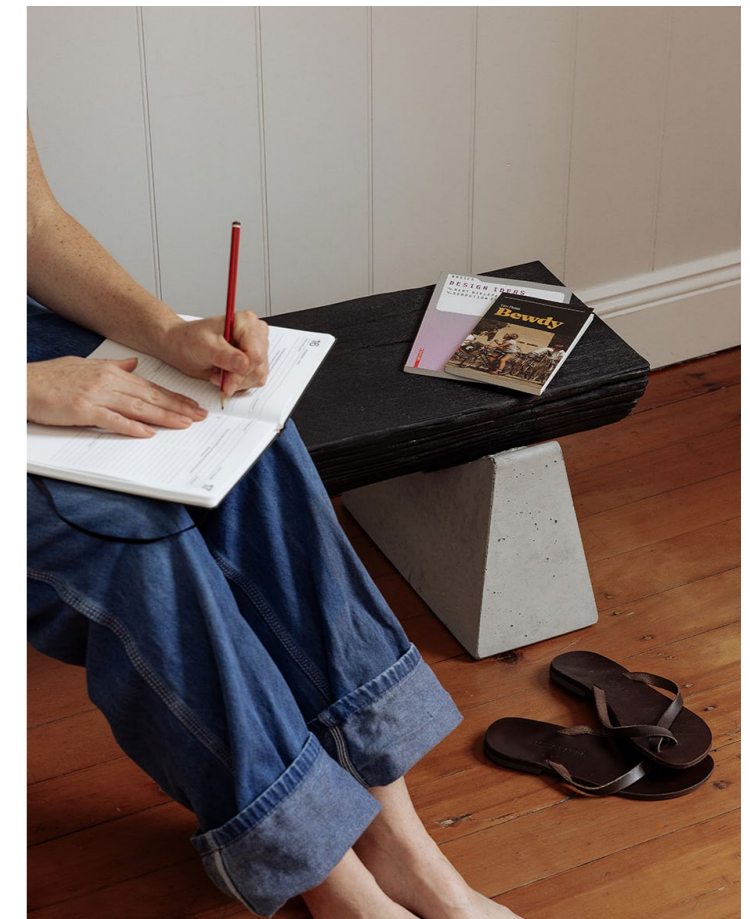

## Stool, Side Table

### Overview

The Hoop Pine Stool is a versatile, handcrafted piece designed for indoor use. Compact, lightweight and durable, it functions as a seat or side table. Its clean lines and natural timber finish make it a timeless and practical addition to any space.

### Manufacturing Info

Each stool is made by hand in our Brisbane workshop. The stools are crafted from utility-grade Hoop Pine boards grown on the Sunshine Coast and sourced through FSC-certified regenerative forestry. Surfaces are sealed with a low-VOC hardwax oil that enhances the pale tone and fine grain while offering lasting protection.

### Customisation

Length and width can be customised to suit specific spatial requirements while maintaining structural integrity. Sizes and proportions can be developed in consultation to align with residential, workplace or hospitality settings.

## Dining Table

**Overview** Our Landing Table is a handcrafted piece designed for dining or working. Combining a solid stainless steel base with a durable Hoop Pine top, it pairs structural integrity with an enduring, understated form.

**Manufacturing Info** Each table is made by hand in our Brisbane workshop. The stainless steel bases are salvaged from tables diverted from a food court refit at a local shopping centre. Originally destined for landfill, these solid bases are reclaimed and reworked in-house, retaining their inherent strength and longevity. The timber tops are sealed with a low-VOC hardwax oil that enhances the pale tone and fine grain while providing lasting protection. Table tops are crafted from utility-grade Hoop Pine boards grown on the Sunshine Coast and sourced through FSC-certified regenerative forestry.

**Customisation** Colour, shape, dimensions and proportions can be customised to suit dining, workplace or hospitality environments, with sizing developed in consultation to respond to specific spatial and operational needs.

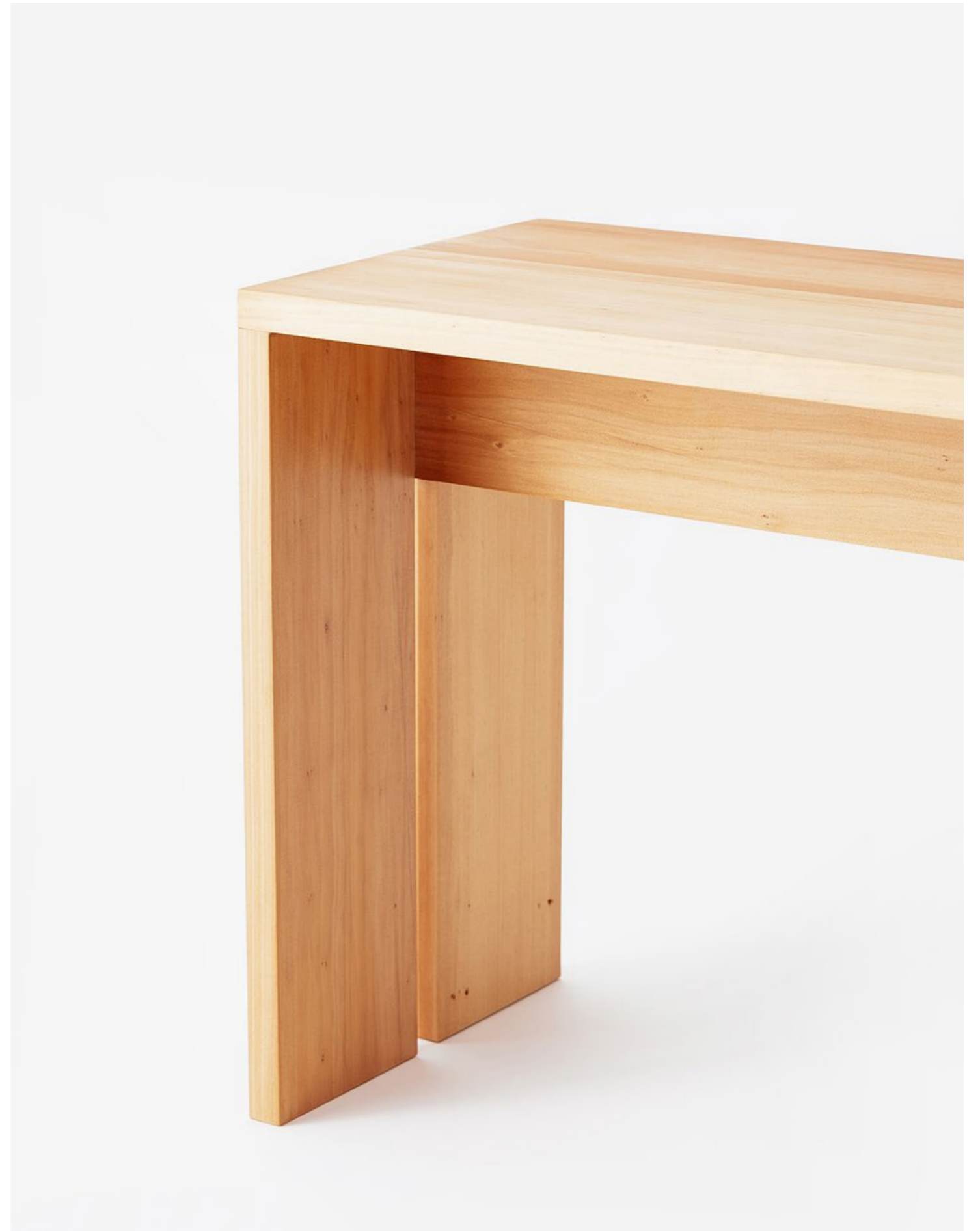

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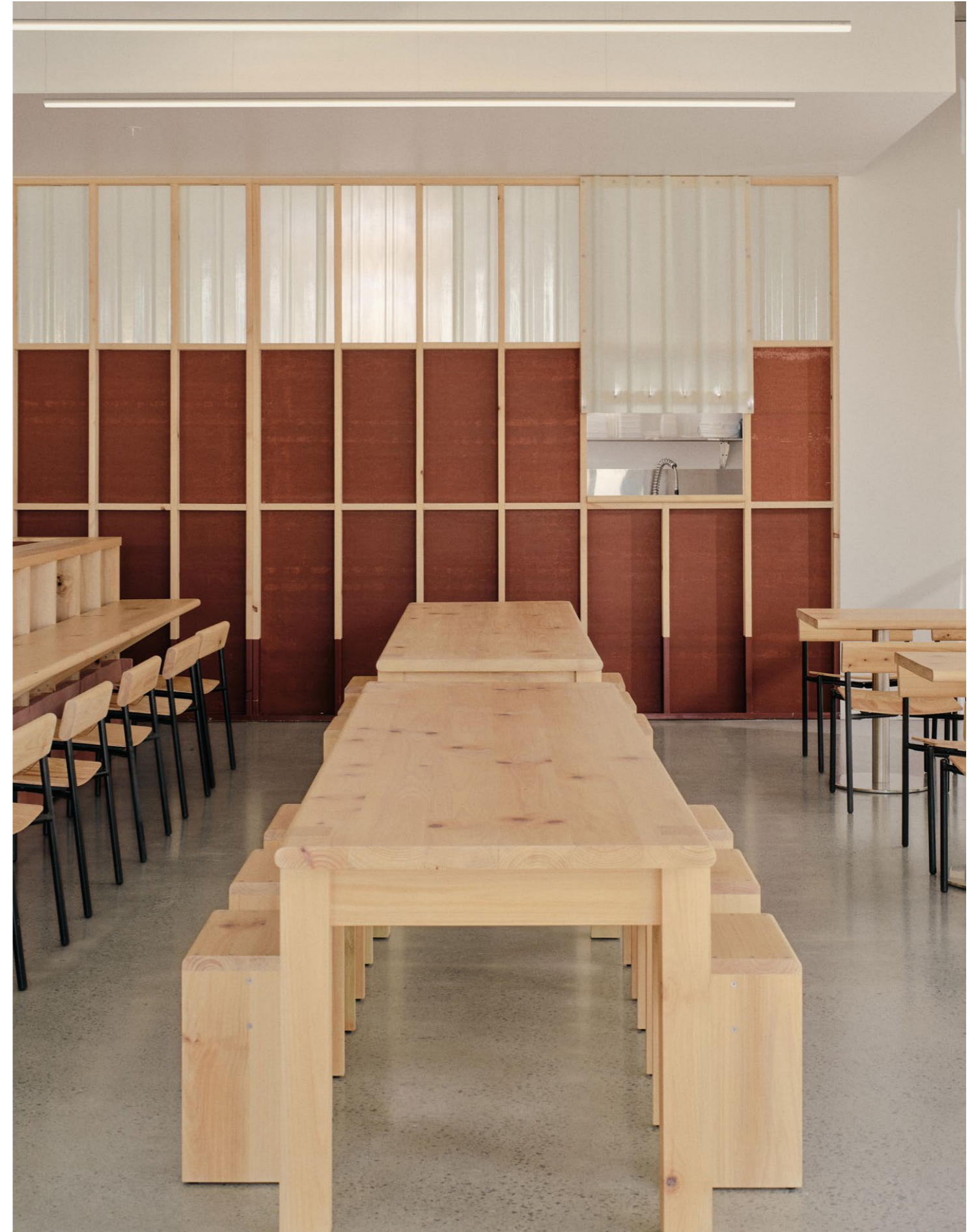

# Timber Table

## Custom Dining and Meeting Tables

- Overview** Our Custom Timber Tables are designed for dining, workplace and hospitality environments, with each piece tailored to its setting and use.
- Manufacturing Info** Each table is fabricated in our Brisbane workshop using locally sourced recycled or endemic timber species selected for durability, character and availability. Materials may include salvaged hardwoods, utility-grade plantation timber or regionally sourced species depending on the project and supply stream. Timber is finished with a low-VOC hardwax oil for durability and ease of maintenance.
- Customisation** Bases are fabricated in-house from recycled steel or timber, with detailing and proportions customised to suit each project. Shapes, dimensions and material combinations are developed in consultation to respond to spatial, operational and aesthetic requirements.

# Galvanised Steel sheet Scrap Sheet Planter

- Overview** The Scrap Sheet Planter is fabricated from salvaged galvanised steel sheet, reworked into a durable planter for indoor and outdoor use. This hardworking material is highly durable, corrosion resistant, and designed for long-term external use.
- Manufacturing Info** Each piece is made in Brisbane using surplus and offcut steel sourced from local industrial supply chains. Sheets are used in their existing dimensions wherever possible, then rolled and joined to form the planter. This approach minimises further processing and generates almost no additional material waste. Each unit carries the markings, variation, and surface character of its source material.
- Customisation** The planter is designed in two sizes to fit a standard 400 or 500mm diameter planting bucket. Alternatively, the planter can be filled directly for in-ground applications.

# Firepipe Furniture

## Office Workstations and Joinery



### Overview

We design and fabricate custom steel furniture from decommissioned 42mm fire sprinkler pipe, salvaged from commercial buildings at end-of-life. The steel is burnished to retain traces of its original red coating before being sealed to stabilise the surface and prevent corrosion, preserving its material history while ensuring durability in new applications.

### Manufacturing Info

The reclaimed pipe forms the structural framework for tables, workstations and integrated joinery. Clamp or welded connections are selected for their reversibility, allowing components to be disassembled, reconfigured and reused across future fit-outs.

### Specifications

The pictured work surfaces incorporate salvaged packing sheets reconditioned and detailed with recycled Queensland hoop pine (*Araucaria cunninghamii*) edging for strength, tactility and longevity.

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# Salvaged Steel frames

## Reworked Dining Chairs

### Overview

Salvaged Steel Chair Frames are reclaimed from hospitality and commercial refurbishments. Each chair is disassembled and assessed, allowing the steel frame to be restored, refinished or reimaged, extending its lifespan and reducing material sent to landfill.

### Manufacturing Info

The frames are repaired and refinished as required. Some are restored to their original finish, others are treated and powder-coated to establish a new identity. Existing timber or upholstered components are refurbished where possible, or replaced with newly designed seat and back elements. All pieces are redesigned for ongoing commercial or hospitality use.

### Customisation

Customisations are developed in consultation to suit workplace and hospitality environments. Options include powder-coat finishes, updated seat and back profiles, ranging from faithful restoration to complete reinterpretation.

- Physical damage resulting from general wear and tear including minor edge chipping or scratching.
- Where the product is installed with known or visible manufacturing defect at time of installation.
- Damage following a failure to follow supplied care instructions
- In concrete, any minor surface irregularities, chips, pinholes, cracks or discolorations, consistent with information supplied on our brochure.
- Damage occurring around undermounted sinks.
- In timber, any minor surface irregularities, cracks or discolorations, consistent with information supplied on our website.

Any claim under the warranty will be void if:

- The claim is not made to Five Mile Radius within 1 year of purchase.
- The claim is not registered with Five Mile Radius within a reasonable time of the defect becoming apparent.

Our products come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the Australian Consumer Law. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or damage. You are also entitled to have the goods repaired or replaced if the goods fail to be of acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure.
